Introduction - Is Jesus God?

This devotional book may help you answer the age-old question: Is Jesus God? Here, we rely entirely on Scripture for the answers, both from the Old and New Testaments.

Hindus believe Jesus is just one of thousands of gods, Jehovah Witnesses believe that Jesus was a god, Muslims believe that Jesus was a great prophet. While there is no clear consensus on what Jews believe about Jesus there is general agreement about what they do not believe, especially about Jesus as Messiah¹. Yet the Bible, read comprehensively, teaches that Jesus was fully God *and* Messiah – even in his humanity.

Many people say: "He is God himself" but can we really say that? How can he be God when there are so many verses that show that he is under the Father or separate from the Father? Does the Bible teach about a triune God? Is it at all important that Jesus is God? Many ask why God didn't make it clear in His word. Pascal², a Catholic theologian, reasoned:

"Because He wanted to appear unveiled to those who seek him with all their heart, and because he wanted to stay veiled to those who flee from him with all their heart, he set his recognisability in such a way, that he gave signs of Himself, visible to those who seek him but invisible to those who do not seek him. There is enough light for those who want

nothing else but to see, and there is enough darkness for the others who don't want to see."

If Jesus is God, then we have to give him the worship that God should have; to neglect in giving him this would be an insult to God. If Jesus Christ isn't God, then our worship would be blasphemy and idolatry, even if he was a higher being. If Jesus isn't God, then many are sinning because they "worshiped and served the creature more than the Creator, who is blessed forever" Romans 1:25.

We let God's Word speak (all scripture references that follow are from the New International Version). More than forty different traits, attributes, and actions of God, that are fulfilled in the Person of Jesus Christ, are reviewed in this book.

It is important to read and comprehend Scripture *in context*. Therefore, you are encouraged to keep your Bible at hand and look up the referenced passages so that you can understand them as the writers intended. The last thing we want is to be accused of using Scripture out of context simply to make a point.

This book specifically focuses on the divinity of Jesus, the One who is God incarnate. For additional study, there are lists³ to be found of the 351 Bible prophecies fulfilled in Jesus Christ.
